



Use an interpreter to report a crime



An interpreter will

- tell you what the police say in your language
- tell the police what you say.



You can use an interpreter to report a crime to the NSW Police.



The police can get an interpreter in any language other than English.

This includes Auslan.

An interpreter can be used at any time.



You may speak some English. You can still use an interpreter if you want to.



An interpreter will **not** cost you any money.

Police can get



- a staff member who speaks your language
- an interpreter on the phone
- an interpreter in person.



You **must** tell the police officer



- what language you want to speak
- all of the different languages you speak
- the dialect you speak
- when you would like to have a female interpreter
- other special things you need.



Interpreters can **not** tell anyone what you say to the police.
